
Stay on Point





Community Engagement Session

2025 Proposed Plan (draft for discussion)

- Purpose: gather input from priority communities on your draft recommendations
- Timeline: March August
- ~8 sessions with community partner co-hosts and priority communities
 - Prioritizing language, race/ethnicity, and geographic diversity; Tribal Nations
- Community partners are regional leads
- Design:
 - Task Force introduction
 - Share subset of draft recommendations
 - Discussion with participants
 - Output: detailed summary of major takeaways

Community Engagement Sessions

Discussion & Brainstorm

- What do you hope to learn through these sessions?
 - What questions do you want answered?
- Who is audience?
- Task Force participation:
 - Do you want to co-host or attend?
 - How would you like to shape the content of each session? i.e. which recommendations are discussed
 - For sessions you do not attend, what is the best way for staff and co-hosts to share community feedback shared?
- Details to be confirmed with community partners
 - Virtual vs. in person; regional priorities
