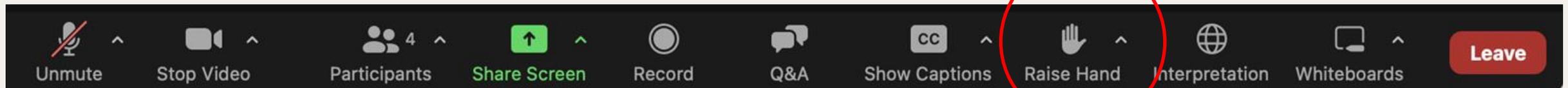

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Grant Programs Research

Overview

- Context
- Purpose
 - Deepen understanding of how existing programs contribute to equitable land access and acquisition
- Methodology
 - Selected 12 programs
 - Metrics developed with Subcommittee
 - Questionnaire for program leads

Grant Programs Research: Results

Responses from 8 programs:

1. Sustainable Agricultural Lands Conservation Program, Department of Conservation (SALC)
2. California Farmland Conservancy Program, Department of Conservation (CFCP)
3. Agricultural Land Mitigation Program, Department of Conservation & High-Speed Rail Authority (ALMP)
4. Urban Agriculture Grant Program, California Department of Food & Agriculture (CDFA)
5. Conservancy Grants, California State Coastal Conservancy (SCC)
6. Strategic Land Conservation Grant Program, Sierra Nevada Conservancy (SSNC)
7. Land Acquisition Grants, Wildlife Conservation Board (WCB)
8. Tribal Nature-Based Solutions Program, California Natural Resources Agency (CNRA)

No Response

- Tribal Nations Grant Fund, California Gaming Control Commission (CGCC)
- Increasing Land, Capital, and Market Access, Farm Services Agency, USDA
- Multibenefit Land Repurposing Program, California Department of Conservation (DOC)

Grant Programs Research: Results

What can the data tell us?

- Data limitations
 - Limited demographic data
 - Level of detail and years reported varied
 - Who benefits when nonprofits are awarded
 - Match funding
- Snapshot of 456 awarded projects, 23 funding cycles

Grant Programs Research: Results

Who is eligible and for which activities?

- Eligible applicants
 - All programs: CA Native American tribes and non-profits
 - 6 programs: government agencies
 - 1 program: for-profit businesses
- Eligible projects
 - 7 programs: Easement acquisitions
 - 5 programs: Fee-title acquisitions
 - 5 programs: Planning, capacity building
 - 1 programs: Urban farming activities

Grant Programs Research: Results

What impacts do current programs have?

- Projects funded: 331 associated with acres impacted
- Dollars awarded: \$924 million
- Acres impacted: 559,594

Grant Programs Research: Results

Are these programs adequately meeting demand?

- Awardee to applicant rates
- Remaining programs range: 13–100%
- 2 agriculture–focused programs: >100% overall
- Urban Agriculture: 13% for–profit entities
- 2 programs: 100% rates for Tribal applicants
- Pre–applications skew data

Grant Programs Research: Results

Do the programs prioritize equity?

- 2 programs designed around equity
- 2 clear frameworks and goals
- 4 vary in progress
 - Prop 68 requirements
 - Internal scoring card and 2025 strategic plan
 - Not a primary focus, but listed as one of many priorities
 - Not incorporated

Grant Programs Research: Results

Do the programs prioritize equity?

- Set asides range: 5–35%
 - Internal program goals or guided by funding sources
- Priority communities
 - CARB's California Climate Investments definition of priority populations
 - CalEnviroScreen's classification of disadvantaged communities,
 - Severely disadvantaged community (SDAC) and disadvantaged community (DAC)
 - Socially disadvantaged farmers and ranchers

Grant Programs Research: Results

How predictable is the funding?

- 3 consistent annual funding
- 3 less consistent with gaps
- 2 completed first round, anticipate additional

Grant Programs Research: Results

How do the programs address scale and land tenure?

- None state an explicit preference for large scale
- Average range: 211 – 2,388 acres
- Individual project range: 5 – 10,000+ acres
- Priority for landless applicants
- Securely held or commitment from landowner needed

Grant Programs Research: Results

Additional highlights:

- Application structure:
 - Pre-application, rolling funding, one application for all programs
- Accountability: Strategic plan guides funding distributed

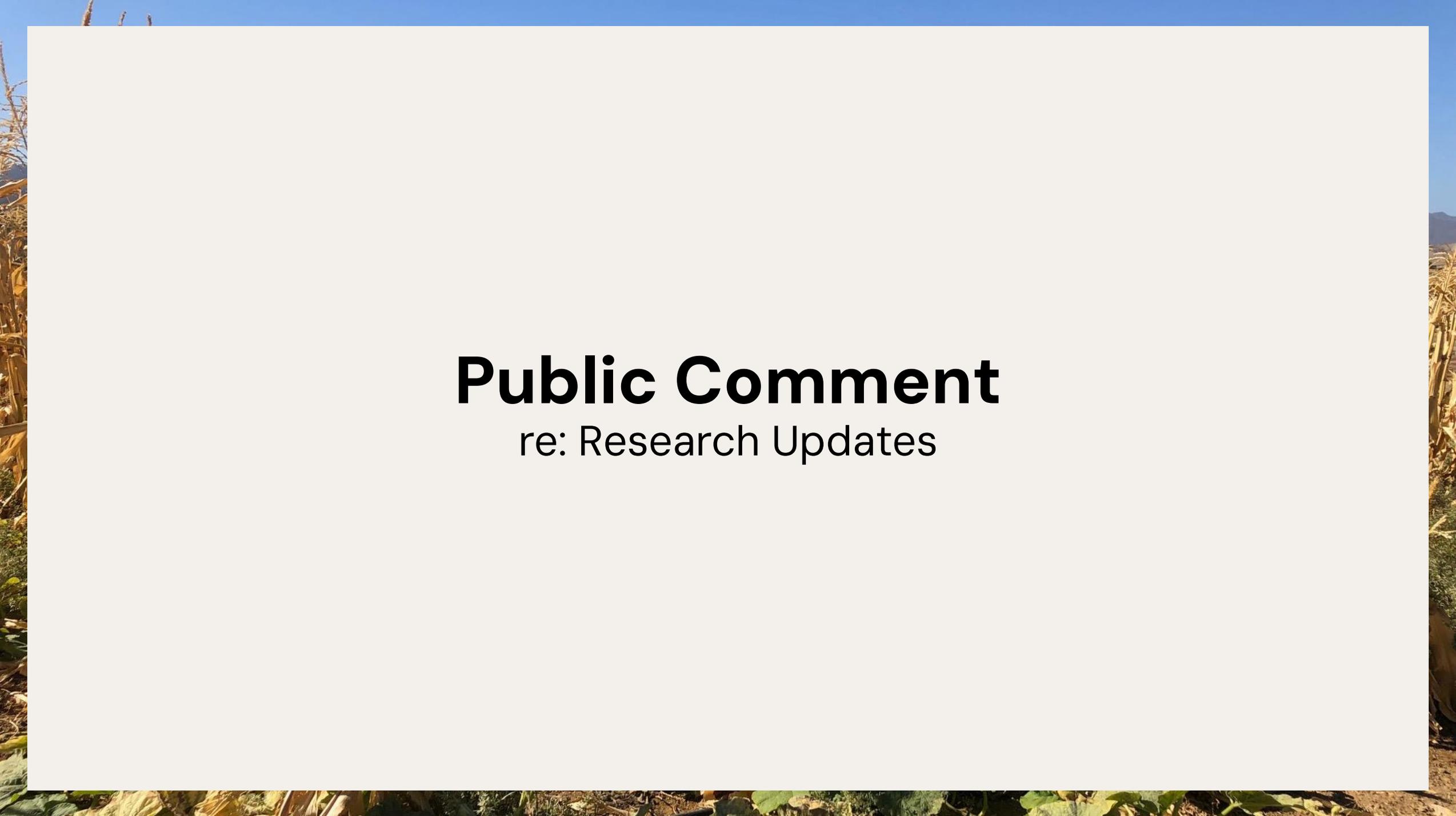

 - Easements, other mechanisms
- Application structure

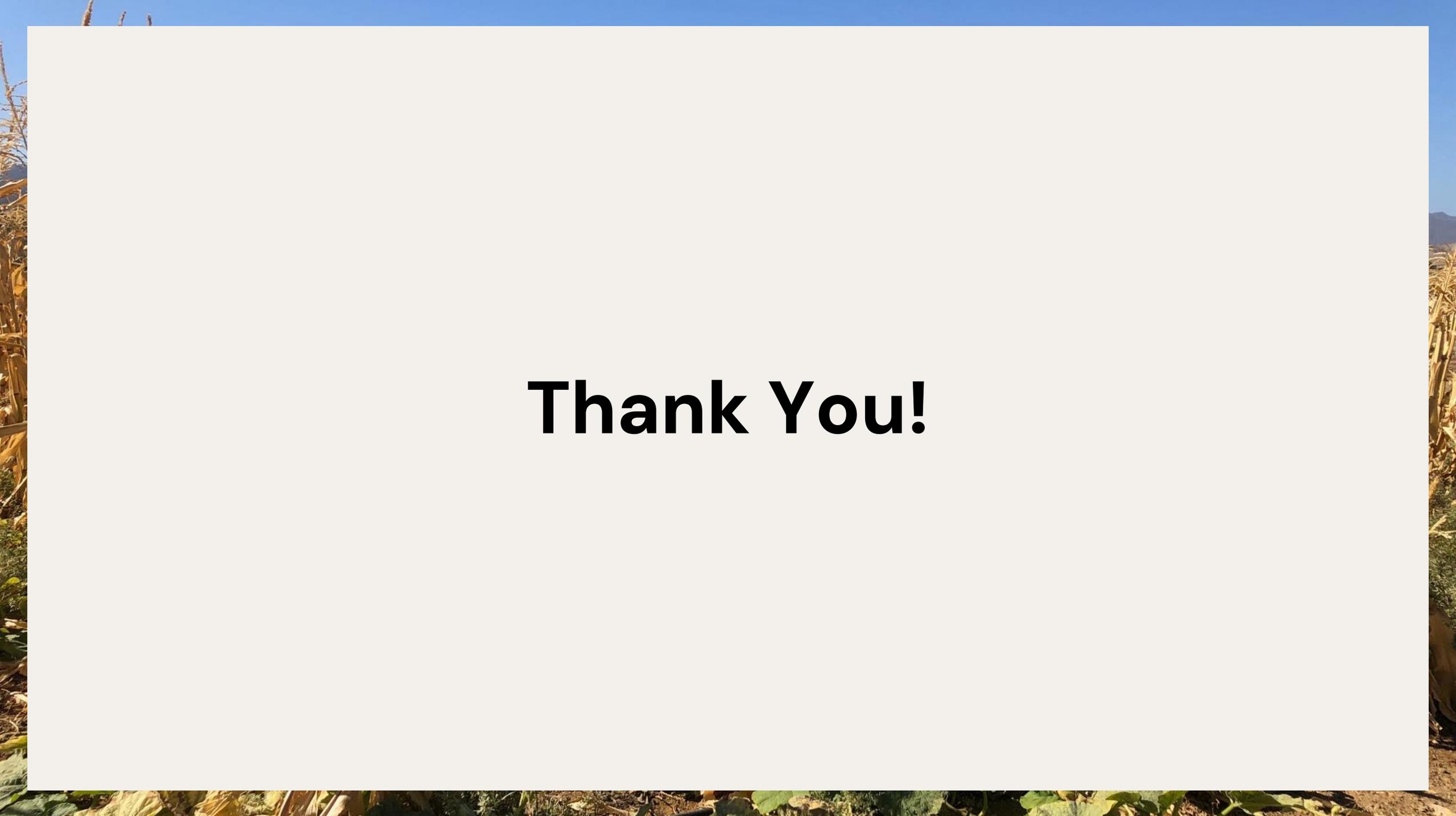
