



2019 HiAP Task Force Planned Activities

This is a high-level summary of priority activities for the California Health in All Policies (HiAP) Task Force and staff. Implementation is dependent upon funding and staff resources.¹ For details, contact HiAP staff or refer to HiAP Task Force action plans.

Priority Implementation Activities

1. Outcome: State government **advances racial equity**.
 - Pilot and evaluate 2019 Government Alliance for Race and Equity Capitol Cohort Implementation Year
 - Adopt and implement racial equity action plans
 - Apply racial equity tools
 - Host Advancing Equity Speaker Series for state government employees
2. Outcome: State programs, practices, and guidelines use **equity and health criteria and metrics**.
 - Provide health and equity subject matter expertise and consultation to state agencies
 - Convene departments and agencies incorporating health and equity into grants, in order to identify and share best practices such as equity analysis criteria, tools, and checklists
3. Outcome: State government promotes **violence-free and resilient communities**.²
 - Engage state agencies and external stakeholders to develop a set of recommended activities to prevent violence and promote resilient communities.
4. Outcome: Priority communities³ benefit from increased access to **parks and urban tree canopy**.
 - Launch pilot project with Departments of Public Health, Parks and Recreation, and Social Services to increase health promoting programming at local parks
5. Outcome: State government promotes active, equitable, and healthy **transportation**.
 - Develop new Task Force action plan on this topic, with internal and external stakeholder input, including local community representatives.
6. Participate in additional activities related to promoting access to **healthy food**, access to **healthy and affordable housing**, and increasing **economic opportunities**, and pursue funding and staff for these areas of work as opportunities arise.

¹ The HiAP Task Force is staffed collaboratively by the Strategic Growth Council, the California Department of Public Health, and the Public Health Institute.

² Additional activities are outlined in the HiAP Task Force Action Plan to Promote Violence-Free and Resilient Communities.

³ Priority communities include those with low access to parks, tree canopy, and open space and burdened by poverty, economic hardship, and health inequities.



Supporting Activities

Convening and Collaboration

7. Hold at least three meetings of the HiAP Task Force
8. Host multi-agency meetings and work groups to implement Task Force activities, as needed
9. Engage executive leadership from HiAP partner agencies to gather input, identify priorities, secure support, and align efforts
 - This includes at least one round of 1:1 meetings with each partner department or agency, as well as multi-department meetings as needed.

Accountability, Stakeholder Engagement, and Reporting

10. Solicit input from local and regional stakeholder organizations regarding actions that state agencies can take to promote health and equity in California communities
11. Provide bi-monthly status updates to the Strategic Growth Council at public Council meetings, and report progress to the legislature in the Strategic Growth Council's annual report
12. Develop Action Reports summarizing outcomes and accomplishments for:
 - HiAP Task Force Land Use, Schools, and Health Work Group
 - HiAP Task Force work to promote violence-free and resilient communities
 - HiAP Task Force work related to food procurement
13. Update HiAP communications and governance documents, as needed

Research & Disseminate the Health in All Policies Approach

14. Provide presentations and trainings, and contribute to research and publications, to share lessons learned and disseminate successful HiAP practices
 - Partner with the non-profit organization Social Finance to explore strategies to develop and test policy messages and tools to define the value of prevention; recommend priority topics for analysis regarding potential outcomes-based payment and procurement for better population health
 - Identify opportunities to build HiAP skills and capacity within state departments and agencies
